First English edition of this series devoted solely to the Eastern Alps previously included in Southern Germany and Austria. A very scarce edition. Endpapers dated "June 1879".

Last and most comprehensive edition in English. This volume includes descriptions and details of the recent Tutankhamen excavations (1922). A classic Baedeker. Issued c. 1930.

11. *Lower Egypt, with the Fayûm and the Peninsula of Sinai.*

Karl Baedeker, Leipsic [Leipzig] and Dulau and Co., London, 1885.

This is the first English edition after the 1881 rebellion and the bombardment of Alexandria by an Anglo-French fleet in 1882 with the defeat of Arabi Pasha. The general map

shows the Egyptian Empire extended into the Northern Hedjaz and in the South to the sources of the White Nile. This and succeeding editions are considered Baedeker classics. Issued c.1893.

12. *Lower Egypt, with the Fayum and the Peninsula of Sinai.*

This first English edition is extremely scarce and rarely appears on the market. It is one of the last editions to still contain the attractive engraved views.

The first three editions (1878 - 1895) were published as "Lower Egypt" and included the Peninsula of Sinai (transferred to the volumes on Palestine and Syria later).

This is the first of five editions published on Northern France. This title was never published in German. This copy has been bound in the "experimental" pink cloth used by the Baedeker company during 1889. It was not successful and the company soon reverted to the usual red cloth.

The International Press Congress first took place in London between July 27th and August 1st, 1896. It called upon workers of the whole world in order to fight jointly for the defeat of international capitalism and for

the achievement of the aims of international Social-Democracy.

The 12th International Press Congress opened in Berlin on September 22nd, 1908 and closed on September 27th. Topics such as diplomacy and the press, as well as the conditions of the current international relations were discussed. The most memorable moment came when on the 23rd, the German Chancellor, Prince von Bülow, addressed the delegates and declared that "no one in Germany dreamed of attacking England ; to suppose anything of the sort was a frightful misunderstanding."

This extremely rare French language supplement with the text taken from the earlier edition of "Allemagne du Nord" was a gift to every member of the Congress by the German committee. Very few copies survive. Hinrichsen S6a.
