

The general map shows the Egyptian Empire extended into the Northern Hedjaz and in the South to the sources of the White Nile. This and succeeding editions are considered Baedeker classics. Endpapers dated "March 1885".

The first three editions (1878 - 1895) were published as "Lower Egypt" and included the Peninsula of Sinai (transferred to the volumes on Palestine and Syria later).
